I was first inspired to write Under Star-Dark Seas while on a cruise. With seven days at sea in a row, I became enthralled with the different characters that water can present when the distractions of land are removed. The piece is structured in three movements, all performed attacca, with each section demonstrating a different aquatic character I observed on that trip. The first movement is characterized by jumping, disjoint lines in the strings, playing the part of the dolphins intermingling with the more flowing trombone melody. Movement two is a storm at sea with intense dissonance and phrenetic rhythms within rapidly changing meters. The harshness of the storm is left behind, however, as we plunge beneath the churning surface. Here, the true nature of the sea is revealed in tranquil yet excited melodies. Not even the stars in the sky interrupt the sense of calm one feels beneath the waves.

All grace notes should be played before the beat, and only slurred to the next note where marked.

Trombone cadenzas are extremely free; notated rhythms are a suggestion, but individual interpretation by the soloist should take precedence.
